**Want to be a part of See Kids Dream's youth resource for service learning?
Here's what you need to know!**

- **You will need to provide information to See Kids Dream** that we will load and put together in a student friendly, attractive layout for you to approve. The type of information we will ask you to provide includes:
 - Basic background info about your organization such as:
 - Mission statement, what population do you serve and how many do you serve annually, when and how did the organization start, how many volunteers
 - Program descriptions
 - Contact info for your organization and where to send money or donations to
 - Wish List items
 - Social Media accounts
 - Photos that tell your story
- **Service Projects**
 - Based on our experience, we believe that no matter what the cause, there is a service project that youth of almost any age can do for your organization. For example, students can conduct a supply drive, an advocacy or awareness campaign or they can create thank you cards or other items that you could use at events or for clients of your programs. For this initiative, we are asking you to be creative in thinking about how youth can get involved and truly support your mission. We will provide you with suggestions and are willing to brainstorm ideas with you if you would like assistance in this area.
- **The annual cost is \$125. Why do we charge a fee?**
 - To make our programs accessible to as many youth as possible, See Kids Dream provides our programming and resources to schools and youth organizations free of charge. Additionally, 100% of all monies that students raise through our programs goes DIRECTLY to community organizations like yours. By asking each participating organization to contribute a relatively small amount annually, See Kids Dream is able to cover the costs associated with providing, maintaining and bringing awareness to this new resource, which creates greater opportunity for youth engagement, and long-term community support and benefit.
