Bullying Service Project Ideas

Listed below are some service project ideas addressing the issue of Bullying. If you decide to do one of them, be sure to check with the non-profit organization you are planning to work with to make sure the project would be something that they could use. We will add more project ideas as we find them.

Collective Thinking - Create a place in your classroom or school where students can post things about kindness, love, and compassion they see around your classroom, school, or community.

Sending Love - When people are going through hard times, it helps a lot to get messages of love and support. If you have seen on the news that there are people who are sad or need help, you can use this project to show you care. Take a few minutes of time with kids and teens to spread awareness for those in need, and empower your them to do something about it.

Anti-Bullying Campaign – Establish rules for your classroom or school about how people should be treated. Create a pledge for the students to sign. What actions can you do to promote the guidelines for caring about others at your school and in your community? Create posters to highlight things people can do to show they care about others.

Getting to Know Others – Spend time at lunch getting to know other people in your school by mixing grade levels and classrooms at the tables so you aren't sitting with only those you already know. Have questions ready for the students to talk about so they can get to know each other.

Anti-Bullying Speaker - Get a speaker or expert (whom they've identified and feel is the best choice) to come and speak to students about preventing or addressing bullying

Don't Be A By-Stander - students work with school guidance counselor to learn strategies for conflict resolution or how to not be a "by-stander" and share what they've learned with peers
