PICTURE BOOKS

Fire Drill by Paul DuBois Jacobs, 2010. Picture Book Jacobs In this story told in brief rhyming text, students in a class follow the proper procedures during a fire drill. (Grades K-2)

No Dragons for Tea: fire safety for kids (and dragons) by Jean Pendziwol, 1999.

Picture Book Pendziwol

When a little girl invites a friendly dragon over for tea, he accidentally sets the table ablaze. There's no need to panic, because this little girl knows what to do when the smoke alarm sounds, and she teaches her new friend to be just as fire smart. (Grades K-3)

Officer Buckle and Gloria by Peggy Rathmann, 1995. Picture Book Rathmann The children at Napville Elementary School always ignore Officer Buckle's safety tips, until a police dog named Gloria accompanies him when he gives his safety speeches. (Grades K-3)

The Odd Squad by Michael Fry, 2013.

When his school counselor insists that he needs better socialization skills after being stuffed into a locker by a bully, middle-schooler Nick finds himself, along with two other misfits, joining the school's lamest club: *Safety* Patrol. (Grades 4-7)

Horrible Harry and the Hallway Bully by Suzy Kline, 2014. J Fiction Kline Selected to join the school *safety* patrol squad, third-grader Mary quickly turns into a bully and classmate Doug suspects she may be tampering with the book raffle. (Grades 2-4)
