### **The Magic School Bus and the Climate Challenge** by Joanna Cole

Ms. Frizzle explains why the earth is getting warmer. (Grades 3-5)

### **This Is My Planet: The Kids' Guide to Global Warming** by Jan Thornhill

The book takes a comprehensive look at climate change, beginning with basic information about how the planet works and moving through an in-depth look at human societies and three specific environments — polar, ocean, and land. (Grades 3-5)

### **Waiting For Ice** by Sandra Markle

Follows an orphaned polar bear cub as she struggles to survive against bigger and stronger bears in their search for food while trapped on an island, waiting for the ice packs to reform. (Grades 3-5)

### **The Changing Environment a Kingfisher Reader**

Introduces the Earth and its systems, discussing the environmental dangers caused by weather and people, how humans can make a positive difference, and the importance of the environment and conservation. (Grades 3-5)

### **Earth's Fever** by Stephen Aitken

Provides even the youngest readers information about Earth, the changes in climate and its affects, and what they can do to help preserve our planet with Earth's Fever. (Grade 3-5)

### **Matteo's Day Off** by Romain Vakilitabar

A boy learns about the power of culture, community, and the implications of climate change on the future of the South Pacific islanders who have become his friends. (Grades 3-5)

**Why Should I Save Energy?** By Jen Green

Children take electricity and other energy sources for granted, until one day their community has a power blackout. (Grades 3-5)

**Why Are The Ice Caps Melting?: The Dangers of Global Warming** by Anne Rockwell

Explains why the earth is getting hotter and what we can do to stop it. (Grades 1-3)
