## Sometimes We Were Brave by Pat Brisson, 2010

Jerome's mother is a sailor in the United States Navy. While she is at sea he tries to be brave even though he misses her and has some bad days. (Grades K-3)

**Love, Lizzie: Letters to a Military Mom** by Lisa McElroy, 2005 Picture Book McElroy Nine-year-old Lizzie writes to her mother, who is deployed during wartime, and includes maps that show her mother what Lizzie has been thinking and doing. Includes nonfiction tips for helping children of military families. (Grades K-3)

## America's white table by Margot Raven, 2005

Three children set a special table to honor their uncle, who is a prisoner of war, and to memorialize fallen service members and those missing in action. (Grades 2-5)

#### The Impossible Patriotism Project by Linda Skeers, 2007

Caleb has a hard time coming up with a way to symbolize patriotism for Presidents' Day until he realizes that his dad, who is away from home in the military, is what patriotism is all about. (Grades 1-3)

Ms. Loupe uses acting exercises with her sixth-grade students at a school on an Air Force base. When she experiences a family tragedy, her class applies her lessons to help her, her brother, and other wounded soldiers. (Grades 5-8)

Piper tries to find happiness in her new home in Florida after her father, a Navy aircraft mechanic, is transferred yet again. This is the first book in a series written by a former Navy brat. (Grades 3-5)

While recuperating in a Baghdad hospital from a traumatic brain injury he got during the Iraq War, eighteen-year-old soldier Matt Duffy struggles to recall

what happened to him. (Grades 6-12)

Robin Perry, from Harlem, goes to Iraq in 2003 to serve in the Civilian Affairs Battalion. This suspenseful and thought-provoking story explores how his time there changes him. (Grades 6-12)
